The Works Council wishes to take this opportunity to inform you of our advice with regard to the proposed remuneration policy for the Statutory and Supervisory Boards.

First of all, we would like to express our appreciation that the Works Council was invited to share its views and advice on the proposed policies at an early stage. In the wake of the SRD II changes and their implementation into Dutch law, the role of the Works Council in helping to shape such policies has become even more pertinent. When assessing current and future remuneration policies, the Works Council is led by the following considerations:

- For the purpose of comparing remuneration with the market, the Works Council greatly values a representative and recognisable peer group;
- Sustainability is a key theme highly relevant to Van Lanschot Kempen in view of its social role as wealth manager. The
  Works Council is eager to see sustainability a high priority on the board agenda and for the KPIs to reflect the
  organisation's contribution to a sustainable society.
